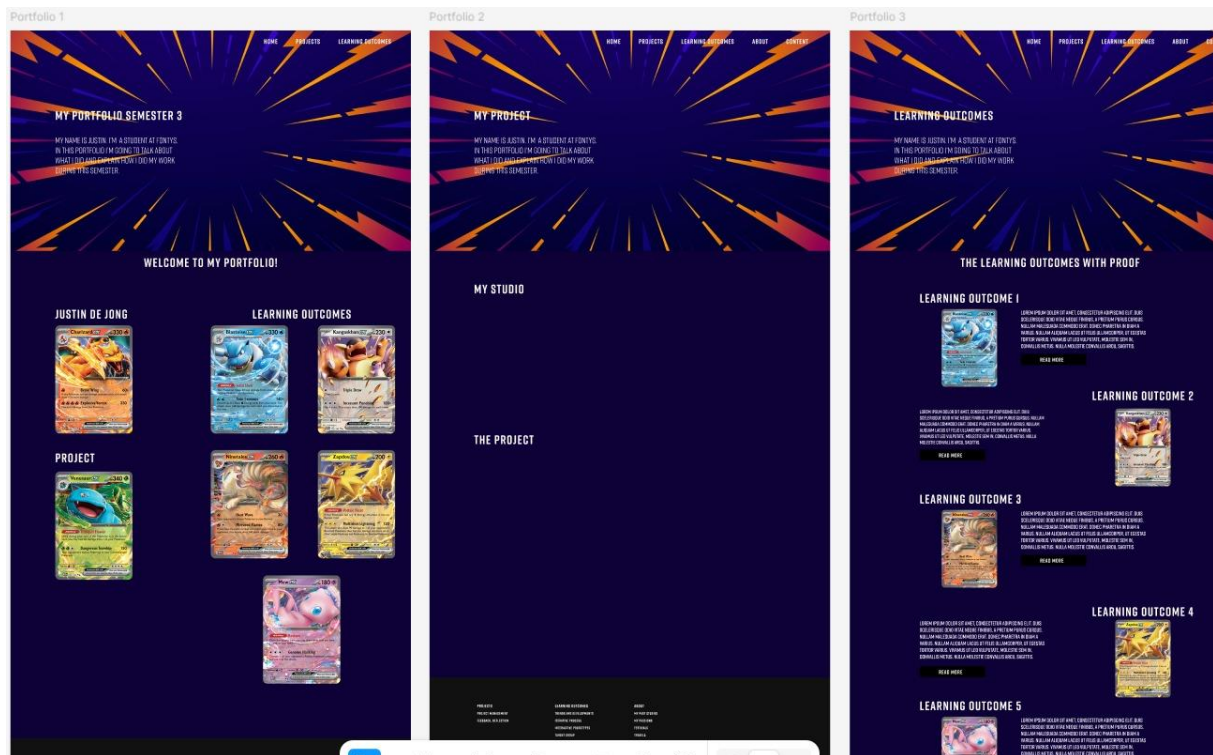


# Iterations portfolio

## Feedback from a personal marketing/branding advisor

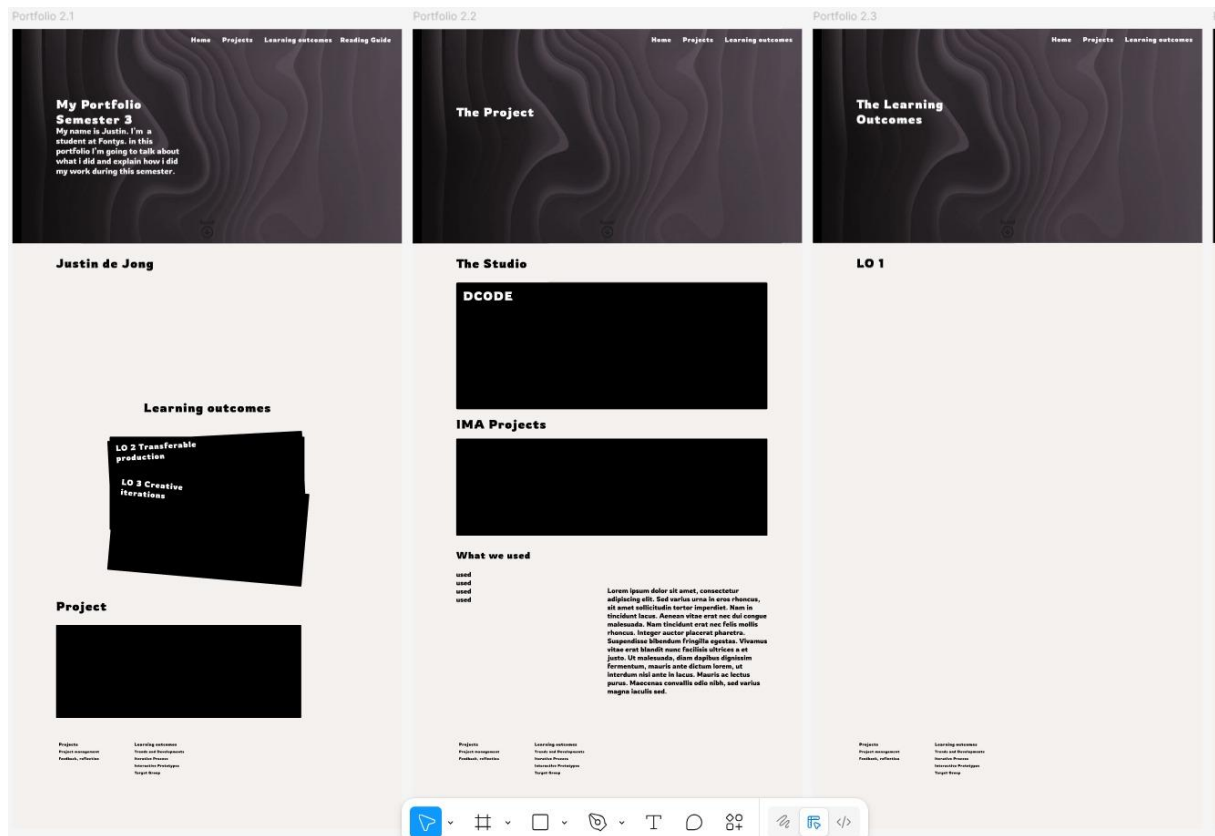

## Feedback from a personal marketing/branding advisor

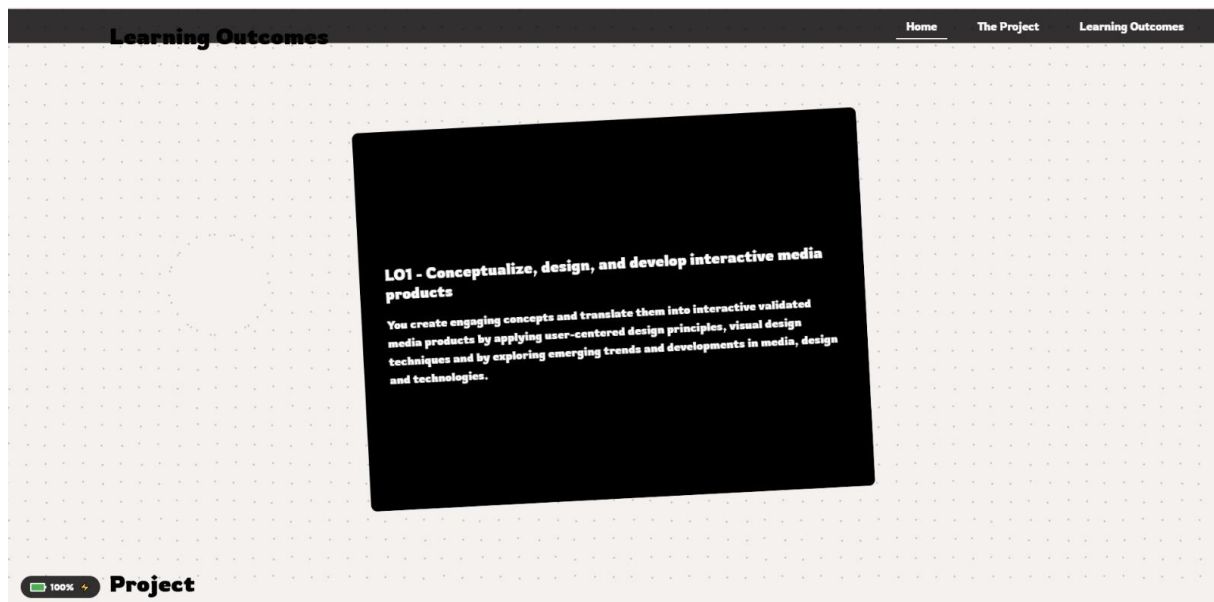
The design is nice but is a bit too minimalistic, it still should be showing your skills. You can try to look at website libraries for ideas and ways you can make it more interesting.
